FORTHCOMING BSDB MEETINGS

(i) Cambridge, March 1980.

The 41st meeting of the Society will be held in the Physiological Laboratory, University of Cambridge, from 24-26th March, 1980.

Accommodation will be available at Christ's College. The local Secretary will be Dr. Martin Johnson, Department of Anatomy, Downing Street, Cambridge CB2 3DY (tel. Cambridge (0223) 68665).

The sessions for this meeting will be:

1. Does the lineage of cells play a determinative role in development?
(1 day; Convener: P. Lawrence).
2. Cell contact and interaction in development.
(1 day; Convener: H.M. Johnson).
3. Post-transcriptional control in differentiating systems.
($\frac{1}{2}$ day; Convener: R.T. Hunt).
4. Open papers ($\frac{1}{2}$ day).

Speakers in the three main sessions have been invited by the Conveners. Members wishing to submit papers on related or other topics for oral or poster session presentation should submit titles and brief abstracts (50-100 words) to the Meetings Secretary (Dr. W.D. Billington, Department of Pathology, The Medical School, University Walk, Bristol BS8 1TD, tel. Bristol 22041 ext. 2870) not later than Friday, 14th December. It has been decided to set aside a period of two hours specifically for the poster presentations and it is hoped that this will be regarded as an important part of the programme.

(ii) Southampton, September 1980.

The Autumn 1980 Meeting of the Society will be held at the University of Southampton from 9th-11th September. This will be the 5th Symposium meeting, on the topic of 'Development in the Nervous System', with a programme arranged by Drs. D.R. Garrod (Southampton) and J.D. Feldman (London).

BSDB TRAVEL AWARDS TO YOUNG SCIENTISTS

The Company of Biologists Ltd. (who publish J. Embryol. Exp. Morph. and J. Cell Sci.) have very kindly awarded the Society a grant of £1,500 p.a. Part of this is to be used to help young developmental biologists with travel to meetings. The administration of this money is as flexible as possible. Obviously BSDB members are given high priority, but non-members who wish to attend BSDB meetings are also welcome to apply. Given the total amount of the grant, we obviously cannot hope to meet the full cost of conference expenses. The upper limits are therefore set at:

£20 for conferences in Great Britain

£40 for conferences abroad

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The time has come to decide upon a topic and venue for the 1982 Symposium. The Committee will consider suggestions at the Cambridge meeting next Spring. The criteria used in making a decision will be:

- (i) It must be of current research interest.
- (ii) There should be no meetings, symposia or books on the same subject, happening concurrently.
