


A GUIDE TO MICROFORM RESEARCH COLLECTIONS IN THE MAIN LIBRARY MONASH UNIVERSITY

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INTRODUCTION

In 1978 Sylvia Ransom produced an annotated list of Major Microform Collections in the Máin Library. Before we updated that list we asked Jennifer Beale to do a feasibility study for the production of a guide capable of frequent updating, and of machine-readable conversion. She was asked to consider a format which would respond to Reference and Audio-visual staffs' needs, not only for more detailed information about the content of the collections, including a subject approach, but also about the bibliographic aids used to access them, as most collections were not analysed in the catalogue. Meanwhile a brief updated list of the Library's uncatalogued collections, including microforms, was produced as Special Collections in the Main Library, Monash University, in early 1984.

Using Ms. Beale's guidelines Rosemary McGinnes has researched the collections and the review literature, and compiled <u>A Guide to Microform Research Collections in the Main Library, Monash University in a format which reflects the perceived information needs of users. Her painstaking documentation of the bibliographies and indexes which provide bibliographic access and control of the collections make the guide invaluable.</u>

This guide lists all the significant research collections in microform, held in the Humanities and Social Sciences Library but does not include some important sets published serially such as the <u>United Nations Official</u>
Records nor individual journals such as <u>The Bulletin</u>.

Some of the collections have been individually analysed in the Main Library's catalogues and this has been indicated in the notes section as appropriate.

The listing has been arranged alphabetically by title. The index has also been alphabetically arranged for access by title or subject with references to item numbers. The subject headings used are drawn from the <u>Library of Congress Subject Headings</u>.

Each publisher has been treated separately. Each collection contains a new introduction and a guide to the arrangement of the material on the film. A list of the contents of all the reels in a particular collection is included at the beginning of each reel in that collection. The archives of each publisher have been indexed, usually in a separate printed volume (see below) with the exception of those for Elkin Mathews and George Routledge which are indexed on the microfilm. Lists of the publications of the firm of Richard Bentley are provided on microfiche, together with two printed indexes (see below).

SCOPE & CONTENT

The British Liberal Party was the dominant force in British politics for several periods in the Victorian age - and even when out of office it was led by giants. William Ewart Gladstone, four times Liberal Prime Minister, is, with the exception of Queen Victoria herself, perhaps the best-known Victorian.

This collection comprises the pamphlets and leaflets of the British Liberal Party between 1884-1911. During this crucial period in the party's history there were five Liberal Administrations, two of them led by Gladstone. In addition the Earl of Rosebery was Prime Minister in 1894-95, Sir Henry Campbell-Bannerman in 1905-08, and Herbert Asquith between 1908-15.

SCOPE & CONTENT

Richard Gough was a collector of books, papers, prints, coins and medals. An antiquary and topographer he was obliged to assemble for himself the materials which he needed for his work because libraries made no provision in this field. Gough's collection of book prospectuses is unique because it relates to a single subject when it was at the height of its popularity and for the period after about 1780, is comprehensive.

The collection can be accessed by means of either a printed catalogue (see below) or indexes on the last fiche of the set. It is indexed by, authors, editors, trans-lators, illustrators and titles, names of members of the book trade or topography, reflecting the contents of the Gough Collection.

The prospectuses, put out by bookseller/publishers in order to gather enough assurances of financial support by subscribers to enable the publication of a work to be undertaken economically, have long been recognised as an important source for historians of the book trade.

The John Johnson Collection (assembled & categorised by a former University Printer) contains an important group of these stray flysheets and sample texts, which occupy a special place in the history of the seventeenth and

eighteenth century trade.

ARRANGEMENT & BIBLIOGRAPHIC CONTROL

As far as possible the prospectuses are arranged in chronological order. The printed catalogue (see below) contains a brief history of this form of publisher's advertising, followed by a chronological listing of the collection, with additional bibliographical particulars. Each fiche has in its last two frames a contents list and an index to titles, authors and translators. The final fiche has general indexes of authors, editors, etc. and of book trade personnel arranged by town.

Every document in the collection has a code and number based on the Harvester/Primary Social Sources (PSS) system, described in detail in the printed guides to the collection. 

During his lifetime Du Bois retained his incoming letters, copies of his outgoing letters and files of his speeches, articles, books and other manuscripts. While these files were most complete for the middle and later stages of his life, all periods are represented to some degree. The files, containing only a few items from his youth, become more plentiful for his student days in the 1880's and 1890's and the commencement of his career as scholar and educator in the 1890's and 1900's. They are at their fullest during his period with the NAACP as editor of The Crisis, 1910-1934 and they remain nearly as

abundant for the last thirty years of his life.


